

About 150 descendants of Casper Engelbrecht gathered for a family reunion at the Engelbrecht home place near Drake on Friday, August 7th, 1936.

Casper Engelbrecht was born in Minden, Prussia, Germany on December 6, 1828. He came to America and to St. Louis in 1852. He was married in his native land but his bride died shortly after they arrived in St. Louis. On the same ship from Germany came also many others, including Anna Maria Schlomann and her parents and brother. She also came from the same locality in Germany and they were married in St. Louis in 1854. Their first child, now Mrs. Henry Berger of Union, Missouri was born in St. Louis on November 15, 1855. When she was about a year old the young parents moved to what is now Drake, to the sight which is now the Henry Jungblute farm about 2 1/2 miles north of Drake, where the family reunion was held. Here Casper Engelbrecht died on January 4, 1877. His wife died on the day of his burial on January 7, 1877. On the day before she gave birth to their twelfth child, Maria, who also died in about 2 months. Another child Louise, born in 1865 also died in infancy. It is a matter of record that they became members of Zoar Methodist Church in 1860, which was then located about 2 miles west of Drake. The old log house, which they built upon arrival, was torn down a few years ago. Some of the logs were used for cooking the coffee at the reunion.

Henry Engelbrecht, the oldest son, died in 1918. Anna, later Mrs. August Witte, the second eldest daughter, died in 1925. Ernst Engelbrecht died in 1928. All the living children were present together with the wives or husbands of the deceased, except Mr. August Witte of Enid, Oklahoma.
